CYCLING ROUTE

GUISVELD

THE CYCLING ROUTE STARTS AT THE POLICE STATION. TURN INTO THE FRFFK FNGFI PAD.

CROSS THE BRIDGE AND FOLLOW THE WATER IN THE DIRECTION OF WORMERVEER.

TURN RIGHT THROUGH THE HAMLET OF DE MIDDEL.

AFTER THE LAST HOUSE, PROCEED OVER A WHITE BRIDGE AND FOLLOW THE TRACK WHICH RUNS PARALLEL TO THE MOTORWAY.

GO UNDER THE RAILWAY AND TURN RIGHT IMMEDIATELY. CONTINUE ON THE BICYCLE PATH UNTIL YOUR REACH WORMERVEER RAILWAY STATION

CONTINUE ON THE WANDELWEG IN THE DIRECTION OF ZAANDIJK.

AS YOU REACH ZAANDIJK. THE ROAD ASCENDS SLIGHTLY BECAUSE OF A DITCH THAT RUNS UNDER THE ROAD. THERE'S A BICYCLE PATH ALONG

THIS DITCH TAKE THE STEEP STAIRS (CAUTION!) TO THE BICYCLE TUNNEL AND TURN RIGHT UNDER THE RAILWAY TRACKS

TURN LEFT INTO THE BENNY GOODMANSTRAAT AND GO LEFT OVER THE BRIDGE.

KEEP GOING UNTIL YOU REACH THE OUD HEINSTRAAT.

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TURN RIGHT AT THE END OF THIS STREET AND CONTINUE UNTIL YOU REACH THE POLICE STATION.

HERE YOU CAN DECIDE WHETHER TO STOP OR CONTINUE IN THE DIRECTION OF 7AANDAM

TO CONTINUE, TURN LEFT ONTO THE BICYCLE PATH.

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TURN RIGHT AFTER THE ROUNDABOUT. CYCLE ALONG THE WESTERWINDPAD PAST TWO RESIDENTIAL AREAS, WESTERKOOG AND WESTERWATERING

BECAUSE OF THE WATER, YOU WILL HAVE TO CROSS SEVERAL STEEP BRIDGES.

BLOEMDIJK RAILWAY STATION. THE RED TRAIL GOES PAST NATURE RE SERVE HET GUISVELD. THE EASIEST STARTING POINT FOR THIS TRAIL IS KOOG-ZAANDIJK RAILWAY STATION OR WORMERVEER RAILWAY STATION.



DE REEF is a nature reserve just west of Westzaan, named after the fen of the same name. The fen is the result of reclamation activities during the Middle Ages.

WESTZIJDERVELD is the undeveloped part of the Westzaan polder, between Westzaan in the west and Zaandam and Koog a/d Zaan in the east. Until the construction of the A8 motorway, the area to the north was also called Westzijderveld. The name originated in the 17th century, more or less simultaneously with that of Oosterzijderveld at the east side of the Zaan. Westerzijderveld was characterised by mills, in particular sawmills and later steam sawmills that set up operations in the Zaandam area.

Nature reserve HET GUISVELD, which until the 1960s was called Westerzijderveld, lies roughly between the railway line to the north and east, Rooswijk residential area to the south, the hamlet of De Middel and the Nauernasche Vaart to the west. It's an area of peat bogs, a landscape that has become quite rare in the Netherlands. As one of the last areas in the country, Het Guisveld is home to nearly extinct plant species such as adder's tongue, southern marsh orchid, round-leaf sundew and royal fern. Here you can also find rare bird species such as the bittern, Savi's warbler, bearded reedling and the western marsh harrier.

The main structure of all three areas is formed by the striking landscape of grassland patches separated by a historical pattern of ditches, an 'archipelago' of grass polders surrounded by water.
